

April 23, 2023

John 3:1-15 (NIV)

- ¹ Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. ² He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him."
- ³ Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again."
- ⁴ "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!"
- ⁵ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. ⁶ Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. ⁷ You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' ⁸ The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."
 - ⁹ "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.
- ¹⁰ "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? ¹¹ Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. ¹² I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man. ¹⁴ Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ¹⁵ that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."

Life Groups Notes

The Woman at the Well Scripture: John 4:1-26

Let someone read the story, then someone else retell the story in their own words.

Imagine yourself as one of Jesus's followers. How do you think you would have felt about observing Him treating the woman as he did?

The woman was an outcast both because she was a Samaritan and because she was known to be a person of low morals. How does Jesus's treatment of the woman compare to how people with similar situations who begin visiting our church are sometimes treated? Have you ever found yourself guilty of avoiding or being less than welcoming to a visitor who doesn't appear to be someone who will fit well in our church?

What is the significance of this story for us today?

Leader notes

The Woman at the Well Scripture: John 4:1-26

Let someone read the story, then someone else retell the story in their own words.

Imagine yourself as one of Jesus's followers. How do you think you would have felt about observing Him treating the woman as he did? How can we create a spirit of acceptance in our church that Jesus demonstrated with the woman?

Discuss the idea of subconsciously qualifying prospective disciples based on their social position. Be careful not to get into a theological discussion of the woman's need for repentance, or of the importance of ensuring new members have done what is necessary to be a child of God. Focus instead on the initial stages of the relationship.

The woman was an outcast both because she was a Samaritan and because she was known to be a person of low morals. How does Jesus's treatment of the woman compare to how people with similar situations begin visiting our church? Have you ever found yourself guilty of avoiding or being less than approachable to a visitor who appears to be someone who doesn't fit well in our church.

Encourage attendees to truly examine their heart. We are naturally drawn to people who fit well with us socially. The challenge is to equally accept everyone who wants to come to Christ, regardless the past or current situation.

What is the significance of this story for us today?

There is a difference between initially welcoming someone regardless of their circumstances and accepting them into our fellowship. Discuss the importance of finding balance between the initial welcoming and the eventual need for the sinner to come to repentance.
