Why we shouldn't judge others

1. It's

1. When I am practicing the

Romans 2:1-3 (NIV) ¹You, therefore, have no excuse, you who pass judgment on someone else, for at whatever point you judge the other, you are condemning yourself, because you who pass judgment do the same things. ²Now we know that God's judgment against those who do such things is based on truth. ³So when you, a mere man, pass judgment on them and yet do the same things, do you think you will escape God's judgment?

STUDY

James 2:1–7 (NIV)

2 My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favoritism. ² Suppose a man comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in filthy old clothes also comes in. ³ If you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, "Here's a good seat for you," but say to the poor man, "You stand there" or "Sit on the floor by my feet," ⁴ have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?

⁵ Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him? ⁶ But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who are exploiting you? Are they not the ones who are dragging you into court? ⁷ Are they not the ones who are blaspheming the noble name of him to whom you belong?

1. How does James lead us into a discussion of judging others?

Luke 6:37–38 (NIV)

³⁷ "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. ³⁸ Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you."

- 2. Discuss how judging, forgiving, and giving are all tied together in this passage.
- 3. How have you seen relationships hurt over judging others?

SUPPORT

- 1. None of us would freely admit we are judgmental, but we do it daily. What are some ways the group can think of to stop judging others?
- 2. What is the best response to those that judge you?

SERVE

- 1. What relationship do you need to work on the most and how can you serve that person.
